

About LKDF

The Learning and Knowledge Development Facility (LKDF) was set up to address the need to promote industrial skills among young people in developing countries and countries with economies in transition. By supporting the establishment and upgrading of local industrial training academies in close partnership with the private sector through Public Private Development Partnerships (PPDPs), the Facility helps to meet the labor market's increasing demand for skilled employees, while at the same time contributing to inclusive economic development. The long-term success of local industrial academies that partner with LKDF is ensured through constant monitoring of economic, environmental and social impact.

One goal of the LKDF is to learn in a systematic way about PPDPs, as this kind of collaboration is an effective and increasingly used means to achieve international development goals. PPDPs are ventures where partners from the private-, the public- and the development sector come together to design and implement a project with a wider development impact. They share cost, risks, rewards and responsibilities.

LKDF Purpose

LKDF provides a means to systematically learn from PPDPs that target industrial skills development.

It aims to develop a framework for such partnerships and to promote this type of collaboration. A key objective of LKDF is to disseminate the gathered knowledge for the greater public good.



LKDF Functions

LKDF has three core functions:

- The learning and development component helps capturing best practices, and summarizes and shares lessons learned from PPDPs.
- The management training component provides support and guidance to training managers and decision makers within the host country's educational training system.
- The project development component ensures the Facility's long-term success by supporting the development of new PPDPs.
