
THE BURE INTEGRATED AGRO-INDUSTRIAL PARK (IAIP) - THE LOCATION FOR YOUR NEXT MAIZE PROCESSING PROJECT



A **growing domestic consumer** market for processed food, including processed maize products

- In Ethiopia, maize alone constitutes more than 60% of the caloric intake of a typical household.
- Given current income growth trends in Ethiopia, the projected growth in demand for maize for consumption is 4.3% annually.
- A key driver for wet-milled expansion is the rapidly increasing demand for high fructose corn syrup in processed beverages and foods.
- The sector growth in Ethiopia is driven by further adoption of Western eating habits.
- 2 Established and continuously expanding source of local maize feedstock
 - Within the Agro commodities procurement zone in the Amhara region there is a **net marketable surplus of 200,000 tonnes of maize.**
 - There were 513,367.36 ha of land used for growing maize in the Amhara region in 2014/25. This area was split among 2,671,519 holders.
 - Ethiopia ranks third in maize production among African Countries with with 8.1 million tonnes in 2019/20.
 - Maize growing areas and **yields in Ethiopia have doubled** since the early 1990s.
 - Ethiopia's maize production are expected to soar, according to an April 1, 2020, Global Agricultural Information Network report from the USDA.

- **Good road network to transfer the final products** to Addis Ababa and to the port of Djibouti for exporting to international markets
 - The Bure IAIP is connected to Djibouti Port through a network of federal and regional highways.
 - The 750km electric-powered railway line between Addis Ababa and Djibouti provides an alternative access to the port of Djibouti for imports and exports.
