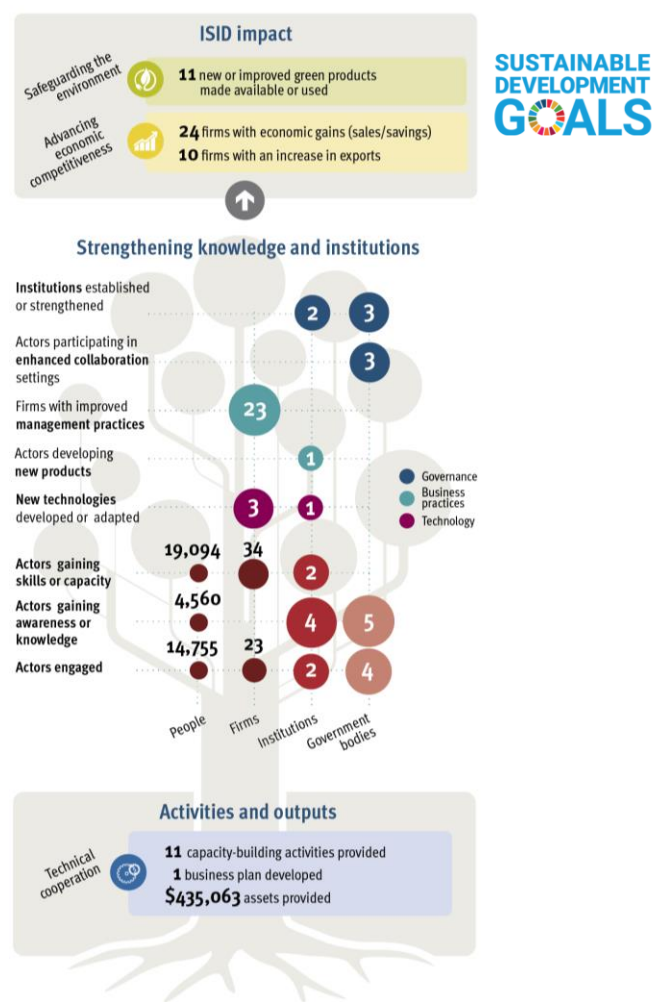

In Ethiopia, sustainability and inclusiveness of national coffee production was enhanced through private and public partnerships.

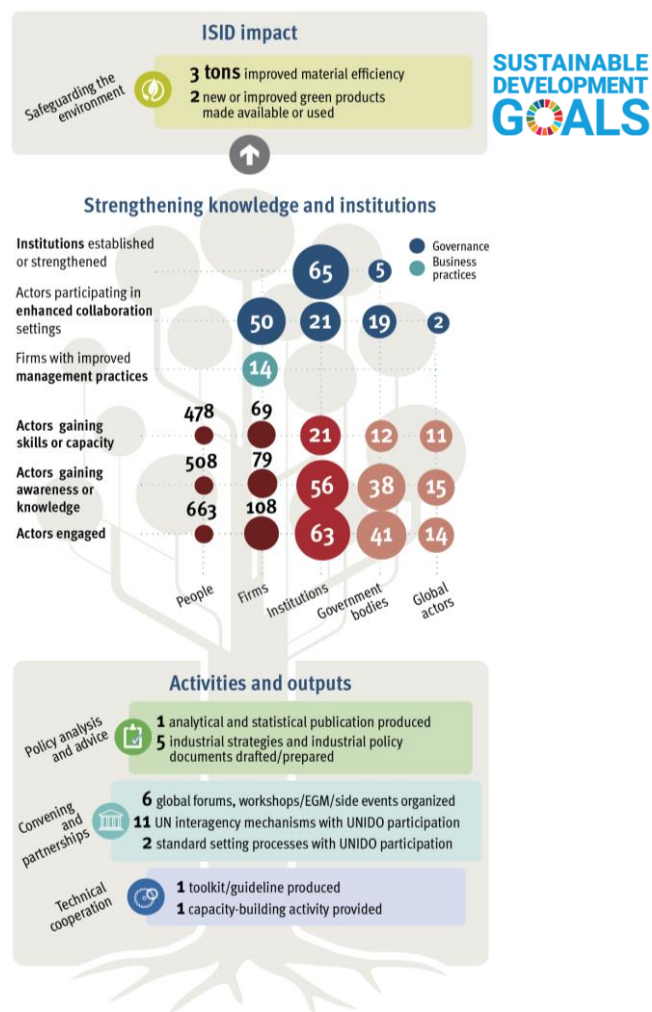
UNIDO worked with the government, institutions, firms and the general public...

It does so by fostering new inter-agency mechanisms and strategies and stronger national implementation capacities, while also improving business practices.

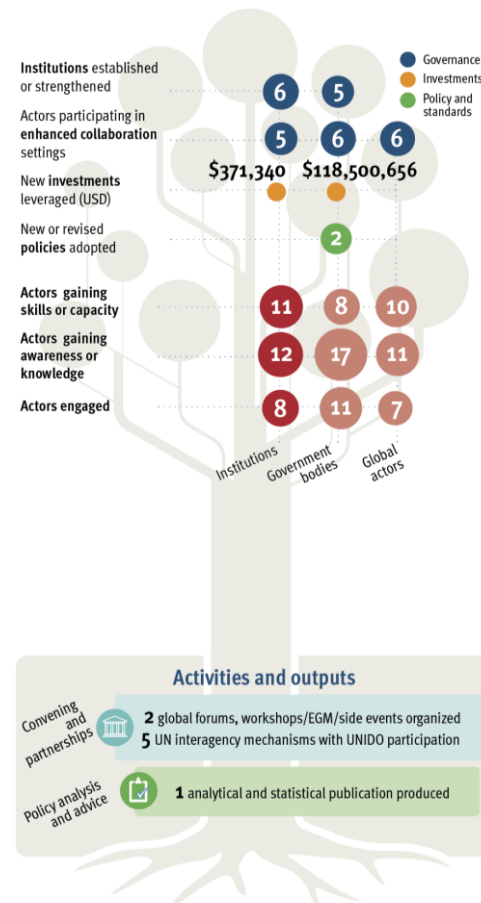


The Programme for Country Partnership in Peru integrates upstream measures and multi-stakeholder partnerships.

It also contributed to leveraging over \$120 million in investments.

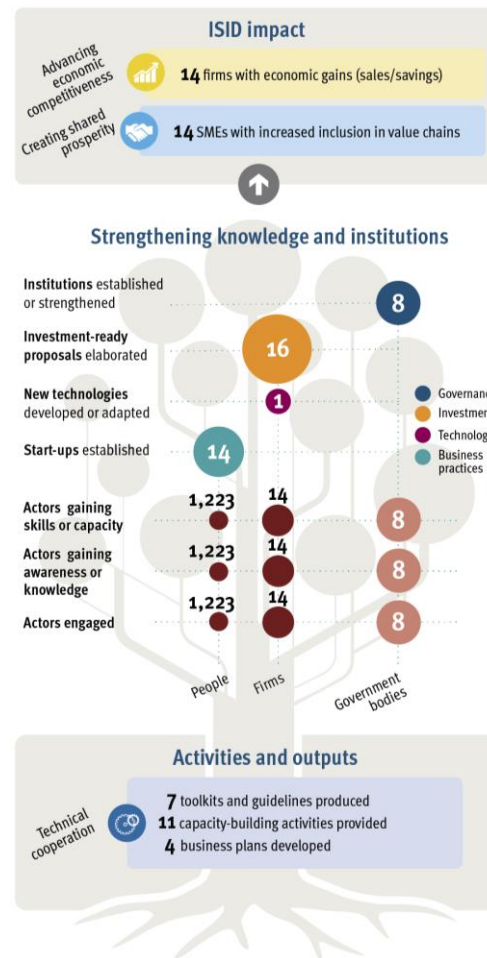
Strengthening knowledge and institutions

As a results, new technologies are developed and the innovative solutions are scaled up in the market.

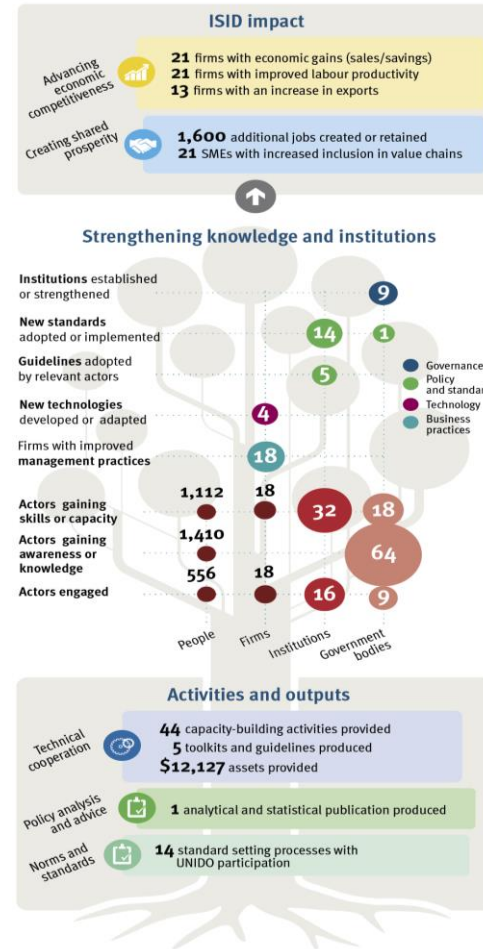




UNIDO's Support to Employment Creation in Mongolia, in partnership with FAO, strengthens value chains to facilitate productive employment and reduce social imbalances.
